The essence od public participation in spatial planning

- Public Participation in spatial planning is a difficult art of sharing decisions relating to the whole of society between the government, residents and city planners. Public participation means to get wider representation and social support for planning decisions, reducing the large amount of existing conflicts
- Spatial planning is the process of negotiating different interests and resolve conflicts bouncing in space. The main function of public participation is to equal opportunities, representing different interests and value systems in the planning process, and thereby affect the assumption of the plan




Reasons for undertaking actions in field of public participation in Poznań

- Depopulation (shrinkage) and suburanization decelerated growth and the position of Poznań against the background of Poznań Agglomeration and whole Country,
- Intensification of investment processes since 2004. Attracting investors policy,
- Liberalization in spatial planning,
- Spatiatial conflicts of diverse character,
- Increasing activities of city movements
- New elements of public management




Statutory forms of public participation in spacial planning in Poland

Statutory forms of public participation in spacial planning in POZnan*




Local spatial development plans in Poznan

- 1. Protection and intervention plans,
- 2. Plans for downtown and historic areas,
- 3. Plans for new urban centers,
- 4. Multifunctional housing plans,
- 5. Monofunctional plans for residential buildings,
- 6. Plans for housing estates,
- 7. Plans for areas of economic activation,
- 8. Plans for shopping malls and commercial areas,
- 9. Plans for recreational areas











The profile of public consultation participants




Age of public consultation participants







The level of Education

Knowlage about the spatial planning procedures








The reasons to attend a consultations meetings




Source of information about the place and time of consultation






